#### **TO BE A POLL WORKER, YOU MUST:**

1. Be a citizen of the United States and a registered voter in Taylor County.
2. Be able to speak, read and write the English language.
3. Be able to attend all required poll worker training classes before each election. (between 2 and 6 hours)
4. Be available to work all day on Election Day beginning at 6am (arriving late on election day will not be tolerated). You will be required to work until all voters in line have cast their ballots and all end of election day procedures have been completed. This could amount to at least a 14-hour day or more. You are not allowed to leave until the Clerk releases you at the precinct.
5. Be able to sustain long periods of sitting and or standing throughout the day, as the demand of the voters may require.
6. Be able to refrain from any comments or discussion concerning a candidate, an issue or a political party with either a voter or fellow worker while working at the polls. You must be non-partisan the entire day.
7. Treat everyone with courtesy, respect, sensitivity and patience.
8. Able to provide your own transportation to and from the precinct. You may have to come to work and return home in the non-daylight hours for some elections.
9. I agree to have my photograph taken for election purposes. This photo will not be released and will only be used in our poll worker database or for poll worker recognition.
10. I agree to allow the Supervisor of Elections to perform a criminal background search if needed.

By submitting this application, I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I am not a convicted felon, or if I am, my rights Relating to voting have been restored. I understand that if I become employed, any false statements, omissions or other misrepresentations made on this application may result in my immediate dismissal. I will faithfully perform my duties to the best of my ability and according to the election laws of the State of Florida. I understand that as a poll worker, I serve at the will of the Supervisor of Elections and may be removed with or without cause.
